An Ordinance to prohibit the parents, guardian or custodian of children under eighteen years of age from permitting such children to be upon the highways in the Village of Camden during certain hours of the night; and to prescribe penalties for the violation of this Ordinance.

The Village of Camden ordains:

Section 1. From and after the effective date of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful for the parents, guardian or custodian of any child under the age of 18 years to allow or permit such child to be upon the public highways of the Village of Camden at any time between the hours of ten o'clock P. M. and five o'clock A. M. Eastern Standard Time on all nights of the week except Saturday; and between the hours of eleven o'clock P. M. on Saturday night, and five o'clock A. M. Eastern Standard Time on Sunday morning, unless such child shall be accompanied by his parents, guardian or custodian or a member of his immediate family who is more than 21 years of age.

Section 2. The presence of any such child under the age of 18 years upon the highways of the Village of Camden either as a pedestrian or as the operator of or passenger in any vehicle during the hours set forth in Section 1, of this Ordinance shall be evidence of the fact that the parents, guardian or custodian of such child have allowed and permitted such child to be upon said highway in violation of this Ordinance by such parents, guardian or custodian.

Section 3. Enforcement of this Ordinance shall be the responsibility of the Village Marshall.

Section 4. Any person found guilty of violating this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$100.00 or imprisonment in the Hillsdale County jail for a period of not to exceed 90 days or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict ~~with~~ ^{herewith} are hereby repealed.

Section 6. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall become effective 20 days from the date of its passage.
