PARK AND CEMETERY ORDINANCE 1996-1

Village of Camden Hillsdale County, Michigan

THE VILLAGE OF CAMDEN ORDAINS:

Section 1. <u>Definitions</u>. For purposes of this Ordinance, the word "parks" shall refer to and mean Chester Park within the Village of Camden, J. C. Community Park within the Village of Camden; and the word "cemetery" shall mean Camden Village Cemetery within the Village of Camden.

Section 2. <u>Injury to Property</u>. No person shall obstruct, deface, injure, mar or damage in any manner, any monument, ornament, fence, bridge, seat, tree, fountain, shrub or flowers or any other public property within or pertaining to the parks and cemetery.

Section 3. <u>Waste Containers</u>. No person shall place or deposit any garbage, glass, tin cans, papers or miscellaneous waste in the parks or cemetery except in containers provided for that purpose.

Section 4. Hours. No person shall use, enter or be in the parks or cemetery between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. local time from May 1st to September 30th of each year, or between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. local time from October 1st to April 30th of each year. The Village Council may, at its discretion, vary the foregoing hours for a special event upon specific request to the Council for such variation.

Section 5. <u>Alcohol</u>. No persons shall use, sell, offer for sale, possess or transport any alcoholic liquor as defined in the "Michigan Liquor Control Act" in the parks or cemetery within the Village of Camden.

Section 6. <u>Violation</u>. Violation of this Ordinance shall be punished as a misdemeanor by a fine of up to \$100.00 and/or 90 days in jail.

Section 7. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective on its publication and rescinds Ordinance #1991-4.
