AN ORDINANCE FILEATIVE TO PUBLIC bylines.

Passed May 16.

The Viltage of Camelon ordains:
Section 1: If any person shall destroy, deface, impair, injure, or wantonly force open any door, or in any way whatsoever destroy, injure or deface any purt of the town hall conned by the corporation, or any of the outbuildings, or any of the records, papers, ornaments, pictures, furniture, fixings or property within said ball; or any of the property belonging to or used by the village in or about its lock; up, streets, public grounds, cisterns, hydramiles or water works, fire engine house, or shall injure disturb or destroy any grave, ornshill injure disturb or destroy any grave, or shall be property of the village of any sidewalk, crosswalk or pavement in any street or alley, public ground or cemetery in said village or any other property of the village of camden, he, she or they so offending shall be subject to a penalty, not exceeding one hundred dollars and cost of of prosecution, and be liable for the expense of repairing the property so injured; provided, that when the injury is accidental, no further penalty shall be imposed than the amount of the cost of prosecution and the expense of making the repair.

Section 2. If any of said property should be owned by individuals, it shall nevertheless be deemed for purposes of this ordinance the property of the village.

Section 3. Any person who shall hereafter be guilty of using, for any private purpose, whatever, any of the fixtures, apparatus, ladders, or other property attached or belonging to any of the investment of the village, or competent court, be subject to a penalty not convection the water pipes of said village, without permission first had and obtained or the same, shall on conviction thereof, in, a competent court, be subject to a penalty not convection shall be subject to a p
