**AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO PLANT-  
 ing and setting out shade trees.**

Passed May 10, 1899.

The Village of Camden ordains:

Section 1. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to plant or set out or cause to be set out any tree or trees on any street within the corporate limits of said village, excepting the same shall be planted or set out within not less than eight feet nor more than ten feet from the outer edge of any street, under a penalty of five dollars for each and every tree so planted or set out; and any person who may plant or set out any tree in violation of this ordinance, shall remove the same upon being requested so to do by the marshal, and in case of refusal or neglect to do the same, then the marshal shall cause such tree to be cut down, dug up or removed, at the expense of the person so offending.

Section 2. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to set, or cause to be set, on any street within the corporate limits of said village, any hitching, awning, sign or other posts, excepting the same shall be set within the distances above provided for setting trees, under a penalty of three dollars for each and every offense.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect June 7, 1899.
