AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO PLANTing and setting out shade trees.

Passed May 16, 1899.

The Village of Camden ordains:
Section I. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to plant or set out or cause to be set out any tree or trees on any street within the corporate limits of said village, excepting the same shall be planted or set out within mot less than eight feet hor more than ten feet from the outer edge of any street, under a penalty of five dollars for each and every tree so planted or set out; and any person who may plant or set out; and any person who may plant or set out any tree in violation of this ordinance; shall remove the same upon being requested so to do by the marshal, and in case of refusal or neglect to do the same upon being requested so to do by the marshal, and in case of refusal or negmoved, at the expense of the person so offending.

Section 2. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to set or cause to be set on any street within the corporate limits of said willage any hitcling, awning, sign or other posts, excepting the same shall be set within the distances above provided for setting trees, under a penalty of three dollars for each and except offense.

Section 3. This crainance shall take effect June 1, 1895.
