

**AN ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO
hitching horses in the streets, and play-
ing ball in the streets.**

Passed May 22, 1899.

The Village of Camden ordains:

Section 1. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to leave any horse kind in harness in any street within the corporate limits of the village, unless such horse shall be securely fastened or hitched to some suitable hitching post or railing.

Section 2. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to fly any kite, or play at any game of ball or any sport with a ball on the public streets or in any church enclosure within the village of Camden.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine not exceeding ten dollars, and in default of payment thereof may be confined in the county jail of Hillsdale county, Michigan, for a period not exceeding twenty days.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect June 12, 1899.
