

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO ABATING, PREVENTING, AND REMOVING NUISANCES.
Passed June 20, 1899.

The Village of Camden ordains:

Section 1. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to keep in or about his shop, dwelling or premises, occupied by him, any offensive animal or vegetable matter, within the limits of the village, or carry on any filthy or loathsome trade or occupation that may be deemed prejudicial to health therein, and any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding five dollars for each day's continuance of such violation, after being notified by the president, any trustee or the marshal, that such animal or vegetable matter is offensive or that said trade or occupation is filthy or loathsome or prejudicial to health.

Section 2. The marshal is authorized and empowered to visit and inspect any and all premises in the village, and if he finds thereon any filth that in his estimation constitutes a nuisance and is offensive to health, it shall be his duty to order the owner or occupant of the premises to remove the same in such time as he may prescribe in case such owner
