AN ORDINANCE TO PUNISH DRUNKEN-

An Ordinance to Punish Drunkenhers hess.

Passed June 6, 1899.

The village of Camden ordains:

Sec. I. That every person who shall get or, become drunk or intoxicated within the limits of this village, or who being drunk or in a state of intoxication shall come within the limits of said village, shall be punished for the first offence by a fine not to exceed ten dollars and costs, and for every subsequent offence he or she shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars and costs, and in default of payment of any such fines or costs the offender shall be committed to the county jail of Hillsdale county, and there remain until such fines and costs have been paid. Provided, that such imprisonment shall not exceed sixty days; Provided, also, that any person or persons who shall become liable for such fines and costs may be employed at labor on any of the public streets, ulleys or other public works of the village of Qamden, until the full amount of such fines and costs have been paid.

Sec. 2. It shall be lawful, and it is hereby required of the unarshal or any constable or prehend or imprison any person or persons found drunk or disorderly in the streets or alleys or any public place in this village, until such person or persons shall have become soler, and then take such person or persons before some one of the justices of the peace of the township of Camden, the provisions of the first section of this ordinance; and in case the said marshal or any constable or police officer of said village shall willfully neglect or refuse to apprehend any such drunken person or persons, he shall be punished by a fine not open and arrests for the village of Camden shall have jurisdiction to hear, try and determine all cases arising under complaints and arrests for the vication of this ordinance.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after June 26, 1890.
