

**ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO WORK,**

-ing out fines, etc.

Passed June 6, 1899.

The Village of Camden ordains:

Section 1. The marshal and street commissioner may employ any and all persons confined for the non-payment of any fine, penalty, forfeiture or costs, or for any offense under the by-laws, or ordinances of this village, in any jail, lock-up, work-house or prison, at work or labor either within or without the same, or upon any street or public works under the control of the common council, and to allow any person thus confined for the non-payment of any fine, penalty, forfeiture or costs, to pay and discharge the same by such work and labor, at such price for such labor, per day or hour, as the common council shall by resolution from time to time direct.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect June 26, 1899.
