AN ORDINANCE,

To Prevent Fast Driving Within The Limits Of The Village Of Camden.

SECTION (I)

THE VILLAGE OF CAMDEN ORDAINS:—That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to ride or drive any horse or team of horses, mules or any other animal through any of the streets, lanes, or alleys of the village of Camden, at a rate of speed exceeding eight miles per hour.

SECTION (2)

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall for each and every offence, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars, nor more than twenty five dollars, or imprisonment in the village jail or common jail of the Countynot more than twenty days, or by both such fire and imprisonment in the discretion of the court: PROVIDED HOWEVER:—
That should such sentance as aforesaid be for the payment of fine and costs, such sentence may further provide that if the same be not paid within a certain time, to be therein specified, said offender may be imprisoned for a period, of not to exceed thirting twenty days, unless such fine and costs be sooner paid.

SECTION(3)

An ordinance entitled "An ordinance relative to immoderate riding and driving "passed May twenty second A.D.1899, is hereby repealed.

SECTION (4)

This ordinance shall take effect on the lifteenth day of A.D.1900.
