

**AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE LICENSING OF TRANSIENT MERCHANTS AND DEALERS.**

Passed June 6, 1899.

The village of Camden ordains:

Sec. 1. That each and every individual or firm desiring to do business as wholesale or retail merchants or to sell any goods, wares or merchandise in the village of Camden aforesaid, who shall not intend or desire to become permanent residents and tax payers in said village, shall file, prior to commencing business as aforesaid, with the recorder (clerk) of said village a statement which shall contain the name or names of the person or persons desiring to engage in business, the kind

of business in which they intend to engage, together with the number of days they intend to remain in said village.

Sec. 2. Such temporary merchants or dealers shall pay or cause to be paid to the said recorder (clerk) a sum as determined by the president and clerk, said sum not to exceed five dollars for each and every day which they intend to engage in business in said village.

Sec. 3. Upon the payment of the said sum for each and every day as aforesaid, the recorder (clerk) shall issue to said merchants or dealers a license empowering them to do business in the village of Camden for the period of time set forth in their application.

Sec. 4. Any person who shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance shall, on conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, together with the costs of the suit and in default of payment, be confined in the county jail for a period of not less than five days nor more than sixty days, at the discretion of the court.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect
