

AN ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO

keeping streets and sidewalks in good order.

Passed May 22, 1899.

The Village of Camden ordains:

Section 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to throw, place, or to suffer, cause or permit to be thrown or placed in or upon any street, alley or public place any wood, chips, glass, tacks, nails, scrap iron or any other rubbish or material which may prevent or interfere with the free and clear passage of the entire width of such street, alley or public place, or which may cut or puncture the tire of any bicycle or other similar vehicle.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than three nor more than twenty-five dollars for each offense, and in default of the payment of such fine, may be confined in the county jail of Hillsdale county, Michigan for a period not exceeding thirty days in the discretion of the court.

Section 2. It is required of the owner, occupant or agent of each and every lot or parcel of land within the corporate limits of the village of Camden to keep the sidewalk or foot path adjoining each respective lot free and clear from wood, chips, and other rubbish, and whenever the sidewalk shall be found encumbered with rubbish, it shall become the duty of the marshal, upon notice thereof, to notify such owner, occupant or agent of such lot. If there be one found, to clean the sidewalk and remove the said rubbish or encumbrance; and in case such owner,
